## **Make-up Exams Regulations**

(Effective starting Make-up Exams of Spring 2011)

- Students willing to take a make-up exam <u>will have to register</u> for it. The exams are classified into two
  attempts:
  - o **1st Make-up Attempt**: students can register for any failed course to be taken as 1st make up attempt in the earliest scheduled make-up period in which those courses are regularly offered.
  - O **2nd Make-up Attempt:** students are eligible for a 2nd make-up attempt if they have a maximum of **two** failed courses within a semester (after considering the 1st make-up attempt results). The second make-up attempt must be taken in the earliest scheduled exam period in which those courses are regularly offered.
- All make-up exams are comprehensive i.e. including all material covered throughout the semester. The grade of the make-up exam will replace the grades of the **mid-term and final exams**. The course work will be counted in the final course grade.
- Eligible students <u>must</u> take the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> make-up attempts <u>within one academic year</u>.
- During the whole period of study at the university, every student will have <u>three</u> 1st make-up attended attempts and <u>two</u> 2nd make-up attended attempts <u>for free</u>.

## 1. Students who attend the 1st Make-up exam attempt and score "F" in the final grade:

- Students who attend the 1<sup>st</sup> make-up attempt and score "F" in 1 or 2 courses only will join the mainstream students. They will have to sit for 2<sup>nd</sup> make-up attempts for the failed courses in the following scheduled make-up period in which those courses are regularly offered.
- Students will be charged LE 1000 for the 1st make-up attempt and LE 2000 for the 2nd make-up attempt.
- Students who score "F" after the 1st make-up attempt in **3 courses or more** will have to repeat the course in the following semester in which they are regularly offered. The students will be considered advising students and will have a tailored schedule depending on the courses they have to take after receiving academic advising.

## 2. Students who do not attend the 1st make-up attempt.

- Students, who do not register for the 1st make-up attempt and choose not to attend it, will have their next attempt considered as a 2nd make-up attempt.
- Students will **NOT** be charged for 1st make-up attempt that they did not attend, and will be charged LE 1000 for the 2nd make-up attempt.
- If the number of failed courses is not exceeding 2 courses, the students will be allowed to sit for the 2nd make-up attempt. They will join the mainstream students in the following semester and they will have to sit for the 2nd make-up attempt for the failed courses in the following scheduled make-up exam period in which the failed courses are regularly offered.

- If the student fails the 2nd make-up attempt, s/he will have to repeat the course in the following semester in which the course is regularly offered.
- The student will **NOT** be allowed for any other make-ups attempts for the course.
- 3. Student who register for the 1st make-up attempt and do not attend the exam for an approved reason by the university (approved medical excuse, official trip or other emergency).
  - Official documents must be submitted and approved by the university.
  - Students will **NOT** be charged for 1st make-up attempt that they did not attend, and will be charged LE 1000 for the 2nd make-up attempt.
  - If the number of failed courses is not exceeding 2 courses, the students will be allowed to sit for the 2nd make-up attempt. They will join the mainstream students in the following semester and they will have to sit for the 2nd make-up attempt for the failed courses in the following scheduled make-up exam period in which the failed courses are regularly offered.
  - If the student fails in the 2nd make-up exam, s/he will have to repeat the course in the following semester where those courses are regularly offered.
  - The student will **NOT** be allowed for any other make-ups attempts for the course.
